What is ME/CFS

Myalgic Encephalomyelitis (M.E.) is a chronic and often disabling illness which causes profound post-exertional exhaustion, muscle or nerve pain and cognitive problems such as memory loss and concentration. M.E. is classified by the World Health Organisation as a neurological disease (WHO ICD-10 93.3). M.E. is sometimes referred to as Chronic Fatigue Syndrome (CFS), or Post Viral Fatigue Syndrome (PVFS).

ME/CFS/FMS (Similarities)

Clinical features in common:

These include post-exertional fatigue/
malaise, cognitive dysfunction, paraesthesiae
or hypoaesthesiae/numbness, headaches,
sensitivity to noise and bright lights, alcohol
and medication intolerance, non-refreshing
sleep, problems with temperature control,
irritable bowel and bladder symptoms.
